 (Griffith) Suggests moving item "A. Resolution, Railbelt Transmission Operator to the last item on the agenda.

B. Project cash flow requirements (State grant request)

- (Griffith) Refers Board members to the document Capital Budget request 5 yr. plan.
- (Griffith) Requests to hear of Golden Valley's desires for north of Lake Lorraine, and specifically is it in conflict with the needs of Golden Valley?
- (Borgeson) Feels inclusion of these projects is important for transmission intertie to the south, to support firm power contracts from the south, Golden Valley's service area economic development, and our participation in the Watana project.
- (Griffith/Evans) Motion: The project cash flow requirement titled "Capital Budget request 5 year plan 08/28/12" be adopted by the Board.
- (Waisanen) Last meeting on August 24, we discussed getting priorities from AEA.
- (Evans) No prioritization list or natural cash flow feedback from the state or EPS.
- (Standberg) Brad Evans is correct we have not received any feedback from Mr. Burlingame.
- (Griffith) There is a natural prioritization for the southern portion first and the northern portion as soon as possible thereafter.
- (Reeves) Does the ARCTEC Board have the authorization from their utility's Board to approve?
- (Janorschke) Is ARCTEC asking for the full \$82.7 million for next year?
- (Evans) Suggests you put the entire amount before legislature.
- (Crawford) The legislature needs to know the total project cost.
